I. TITLE: Articulated Doctor of Chiropractic Agreement

II. TYPE OF AGREEMENT: Pre-requisite program for entrance into the Doctor of Chiropractic program at LIFE UNIVERSITY

III. PURPOSE: The purpose of the following articulated agreement is to facilitate the transfer of HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE students to the Doctor of Chiropractic program at LIFE UNIVERSITY.

V. COUNCIL ON CHIROPRACTIC EDUCATION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Below are the present requirements for entrance into the Doctor of Chiropractic program. These requirements are established by the Council on Chiropractic Education (CCE), the accrediting agency for chiropractic. They may be changed or modified by the CCE. If they are modified, LIFE UNIVERSITY will notify HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE upon receipt of notification of the changes.

* The Social Science/Humanities requirement may contain courses from the following categories: Social Sciences: Anthropology, Criminal Justice, Economics, Geography, Government, History, Psychology, Sociology, Political science, Humanities: Art, Classics, Communications, Dance, Drama, English, Film, Fine Arts, Foreign Language, Journalism, Language, Literature, Music, Philosophy, Religion, Speech, & Theatre. ** Cell or Human biology, or Anatomy and Physiology is accepted. Botany or plant biology is not accepted. *** 3 semester hours of General or Inorganic Chemistry, 6 semester hours of Organic or Biochemistry are required. Also, 6 of the 12 semester hours must have a lab.

**** One Physics class with lab is required. A lab is not required with the second Physics class. Also, one of the following 4 courses may substitute for the second Physics course: Exercise Physiology, Kinesiology, Biomechanics, or any type of Statistics such as Math Statistics, Psychology Statistics, etc.

A single course may count in only one category. For example, one English course may be used to meet the English category or the Social Science/Humanities category requirement but not both. Non-science CLEP courses and non-science Advanced Placement (AP) courses will also be accepted towards fulfilling these requirements. In addition, students will be required to complete a total of 90 semester hours to meet the entrance requirement.

All pre-requisite course work for admission to the chiropractic program must be completed with a grade of 2.0 ("C") or above on a 4.0 scale. In addition, the grade point average of the specific course requirements must average 2.5 or higher and the cumulative grade point average of all college courses must average 2.5 or higher. If the cumulative GPA averages below 2.5 then the average of the best 90 semester hours will be calculated.

VII. LIFE UNIVERSITY BACHELOR'S DEGREE CURRICULUM

Once HCC students meet the admission requirements for the Doctor of Chiropractic program, they will be accepted by Life University. Students will be simultaneously enrolled in the Doctor of Chiropractic program and the Bachelor of Science in Biology program. Once all the graduation requirements have been met for the BS program, the degree will be awarded.

VIII. LIFE UNIVERSITY DOCTOR OF CHIROPRACTIC CURRICULUM

Once enrolled in Life University, students will continue their course work in LU's Doctorate of Chiropractic program. Students will be eligible to receive a Doctorate of Chiropractic degree upon successful completion of all LU graduation requirements.

IX. PROVISIONS

A. ADMISSION

HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE: Current HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE policies apply. HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE retains sole responsibility for establishing the academic and other criteria that students must meet in order to fulfill its own entrance and graduation requirements and in evaluating student applications for admission.

LIFE UNIVERSITY: LIFE UNIVERSITY will admit to professional level status towards a chiropractic degree, students who complete the articulated pre-requisite requirements at HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE. LIFE UNIVERSITY retains sole responsibility for establishing the academic and other criteria that students must meet in order to fulfill its own entrance and graduation requirements and in evaluating student applications for admission. Incoming students must meet all entry requirements for the Doctor of Chiropractic program. Acceptance into the chiropractic program does not guarantee successful completion of course requirements, leading to a degree of Doctor of Chiropractic.

LIFE UNIVERSITY will waive the application fee for HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE students applying to the chiropractic or pre-chiropractic program.

^{*}Any courses in this section that are not completed Hillsborough Community College may be completed at Life University prior to admission to the chiropractic program.

B. FINANCIAL AID

Students may apply to Hillsborough Community College for financial aid during Years One through Two. While in the last semester of the HCC associate of arts degree, students should apply to Life University, apply for financial aid, and seek permission to become a concurrently enrolled student at HCC for the 'bridge program year.' The bridge program year will be handled through the financial aid consortium agreement between HCC and LU. Once enrolled in Life University's Doctor of Chiropractic program, students may apply for professional school financial aid through LU pursuant to applicable LU policies and procedures.

C. CATALOG IN EFFECT/CONTINUOUS ENROLLMENT

LIFE UNIVERSITY: Students who complete the course work under the terms of the catalog in effect during the term of their first registration must graduate within eight years of first admission to LIFE UNIVERSITY.

D. GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

Refer to Section VI of this document. Programs covered by this agreement shall be conducted under the direct supervision of the faculty and staff who provide the undergraduate and professional course work, respectively.

The LIFE UNIVERSITY coordinator shall be the Dean of the College of Chiropractic. The LIFE UNIVERSITY coordinator shall be responsible for those program components that must be executed on the LIFE UNIVERSITY campus and shall communicate all appropriate matters directly with the HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE coordinator.

The HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE coordinator shall be the Director of Associate in Arts Programs. The HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE coordinator shall be responsible for the program components that must be executed on the HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE campus and shall communicate all appropriate matters directly with the LIFE UNIVERSITY coordinator.

E. GRADING POLICIES

LIFE UNIVERSITY Graduation from the doctorate degree program at LIFE UNIVERSITY requires a minimum cumulative "C" (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) in LIFE UNIVERSITY course work.

F. COURSE REPEATS/FORGIVENESS POLICY

HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE: Courses in which a "C" or better is earned cannot be repeated. All course attempts will appear on the transcript. Courses in which a grade of "D" or "F" is earned may be repeated for credit, and only the most recent grade earned will be used to calculate the cumulative grade point average.

NOTE: Some courses may be repeated for credit; e.g., JOU 1949. This means the grade and quality points earned in each attempt for this course will be included in the GPA computation. Grade forgiveness does not apply to a course that may be taken more than one time for credit. Check the course description to determine if a course may be repeated for credit.

Students may attempt a course only three times — including the first attempt, repeat grades, and withdrawals. Permission for a fourth attempt will be granted only through the academic appeals process. Permission will be granted only to students who can document major extenuating circumstances. Students who wish to begin the academic appeals process should contact the appropriate campus dean of student services. Grades for the third and all subsequent attempts will be included in calculating grade point averages.

NOTE: Some colleges and universities may not accept grades earned for repeated courses; some might use only the grades originally earned. Students receiving financial assistance of any type should speak with a financial aid counselor to ensure that any repeat attempts will qualify for aid.

LIFE UNIVERSITY: The LIFE UNIVERSITY Office of Admissions calculates GPAs for all transfer/entering students using the last grade earned. With regard to withdrawals and incompletes, the transcript information provided by the reporting institution is honored.

G. WAIVERS OR SUBSTITUTIONS

Any waiver or substitution of coursework at HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE must have prior approval by LIFE UNIVERSITY.

H. MINIMUM UPPER DIVISION HOURS

LIFE UNIVERSITY Doctor of Chiropractic admission requirements stipulate no semester hours of upper division coursework.

I. UPDATES AND TERMINATION

General: HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S performance under this Agreement and any amendments hereto or attachments connected herewith, shall at all times be subject to any and all state laws, state regulations and Board of Trustee Rules which are applicable to the College's operations, commitments and/or activities in furtherance of any terms specified herein.

This agreement is subject to change by the LIFE UNIVERSITY Board of Trustees or the HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE Board of Trustees.

Update: This articulated curriculum agreement will be reviewed every year and shall be in effect from the date signed until any party identifies need for revision. The institution initiating the change will notify the other concerning any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this agreement. Revisions will be made in writing and reviewed by the two respective Chief Academic Officers or their designees.

This articulation agreement will be reviewed and updated by HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE and the LIFE UNIVERSITY articulation officers.

Termination: Should this agreement be terminated, HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE students in the process of applying to LIFE UNIVERSITY at the time of cancellation will be allowed to complete the application process and complete degrees, subject to the requirement to complete the degree within eight years of the first LIFE UNIVERSITY course enrollment.

This agreement is effective only under the condition that both institutions maintain current accreditation by a regional accrediting association as recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. In the event either institution loses its accreditation, this agreement will immediately terminate.

J. OTHER

Any variation in this program may result in additional required coursework.

K. LENGTH OF AGREEMENT

This articulation agreement shall be in effect from its date of signing until termination by either party upon ninety (90) days notice to the other party in writing. This agreement may be modified or amended by mutual consent by the two participating institution presidents or their specified designees in writing.

Appendix B

Life University Curriculum

A BS in Biology degree will be awarded to any student who meets the following criteria.

- A total of 90 semester hours (135 quarter hours) of undergraduate coursework is required for admission to the chiropractic program. These hours may also be transferred into Life University's undergraduate program.
- Additionally, 53 quarter credit hours from the chiropractic program can transfer down to the undergraduate program to fulfill the program requirements. The courses that can transfer are: BIO 302 Embryology, BIO 303 Histology, BIO 410 Neurophysiology, BIO 425 Visceral Physiology, BIO 431 Microbiology I, BIO 433 Microbiology II, BIO 435 Physiology Lab, BIO 437 Immunology & Disease Patterns, BIO 441 Pathology I, BIO 442 Pathology II, BIO 445 Endocrinology, CHM 315 Biochemistry I, and CHM 316 Biochemistry II.
- 3. The remaining four courses that are not part of the chiropractic curriculum that must be taken to fulfill the BS in Biology requirements are:
- BIO 312 Cell Biology
- BIO 315 Principles of Ecology
- · BIO 316 Principles of Genetics
- BIO 335 Vertebrate Physiology

These four courses may be taken while a student is enrolled in the chiropractic program – one per quarter as long as the student is not on academic probation. Or, these courses may be taken as part of the original 90 semester hours required for entrance into the chiropractic program, if available. The student must also meet the minimum GPA requirement of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. At the conclusion of the completion of all the requirements stated above, the student is awarded the Bachelor of Science in Biology degree.
