SUGGESTED GUIDELINES FOR HOSPITALITY & TOURISM MANAGEMENT (AS.HFT.RESH)

An Associate in Science degree that can articulate into a baccalaureate degree is allowed under the provisions of the Florida state board of Education rule 6A-10.024. This particular degree program can transfer into the following university degree programs:

The universities for the 2005/2006 year that are offering the aforementioned university articulated degree programs are as follows:

Hospitality Administration/Management

Track 1 – FIU, UCF, UWF

Track 2 – FSU (limited access)

The following list of common prerequisite courses should be taken at the CC prior to transferring: ACG 2021, ACG 2071, CGS 1000, ECO 2013, ECO 2023, MAC 2233, and STA 2023.

Track 3 – USF

The following list of common prerequisite courses should be taken at the CC prior to transferring: ACG 2021, ACG 2071, ECO 2013, ECO 2023.

The articulated AS in Hospitality & Tourism Management shall include:

- Eighteen (18) credit hours of general education courses including the following designated courses: ENC 1101 and ENC 1102.
- Forty-six (46) hours in technical core courses, including common prerequisite HFT x000.

The baccalaureate in Hospitality Administration/Management shall include:

- The remaining eighteen (18) hours of general education to be taken at the university .
- Forty-two (42) hours in professional courses.
- Completion of CFAST by the time the student reaches 36 semester hours of upper division work at the senior institution.

All transferring students must meet the senior-institution admissions requirements (e.g., the foreign language admissions requirement at the senior institution).
