### Footnotes:

- 1) Enrollment is unduplicated; students with multiple programs are classified according to the highest level program found.
- 2) Adult General Education is the aggregation of Adult Basic Education, Adult English and GED Preparation.
- 3) Students enrolled in the Associate of Arts may have multiple program records. To unduplicate, students with an A.A. and an A.S. degree were counted only as an A.S. student under the heading Technical Programs and within the program
- 4) Developmental students were enrolled in at least one non-college level developmental course. Students are also coded in their intended program.
- 5) EAP students have been classified as prep or undergraduate based on course enrollment. Students are also coded in their intended program.
- 6) A.S. and A.A.S. degrees are classified at the same level, students with multiple A.S. and A.A.S. records were classified according to the first program found based on program CIP codes.
- 7) Program names are based on state classification of instructional program (CIP) code.
- 8) Inactive program. Even though a program is inactive, it is still possible for students to be coded in the system with an inactive program code.
- 9) A zero in any program row count means no enrollment, a dash in any program row count means that the program was either inactive, or not in the college's portfolio of current programs.
