Hillsborough Community College-Ybor City Campus presents [The Eighth Annual Ybor Festival of the Moving Image](#), Wednesday, April 7, through Sunday, April 11.

This eclectic film festival explores the cinematic world of independent artists and filmmakers, offering a spectrum of features, documentaries and personal films, plus live performances, workshops and lectures.

The 2010 festival will continue to examine the social, political and philosophical implications and effects of art on the history of film, and the effects of these films on American culture.

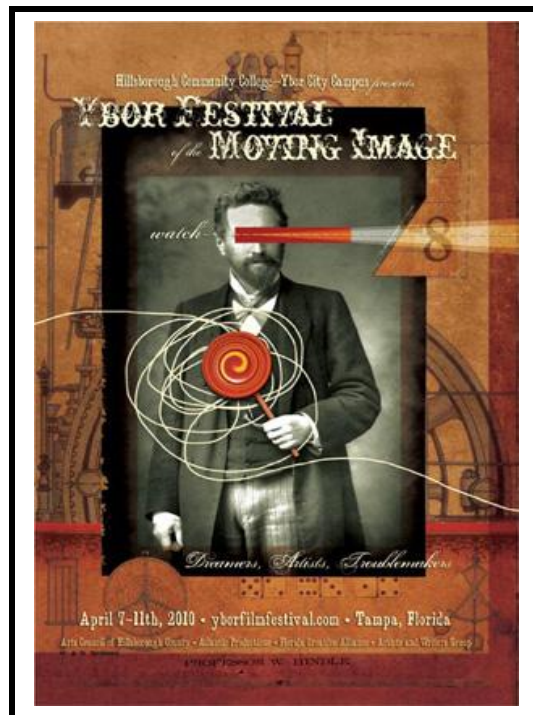
Another theme, *Global Snapshots*, presents innovative films exploring the culturally diverse realms of our lives while challenging pre-existing notions of our world. The feature documentaries

selected will illuminate contemporary political and cultural issues affecting and influencing our daily life.

Screenings will be held at Hillsborough Community College-Ybor, in the HCC Performing Arts Building at the corner of Palm Ave

and 14th Street, Tampa, Florida, USA.

Reflections Chamber Ensemble Play the Music of Olivier Messiaen on April 11

The Chamber Music Ybor Visual and Performing Arts Series presents a concert by the Reflections Chamber Ensemble on April 11 at 3pm in the Mainstage Theatre at the HCC Ybor City Campus.

[The Reflections Chamber Ensemble](#) is scheduled to play Messiaen's *Quartet for the End of Time*, a piece Messiaen wrote while a prisoner in a German prisoner of war camp during World War II.

According to About.com, Messiaen returned to France after the war and taught at the Conservatoire from 1947 to 1978. His music during this period was inspired by "his quasi-mystical devout Catholic faith. His love of nature is evident in his many works inspired by birdsong. He also was influenced rhythmically by his study of Indian music, and he systematically explored nontonal harmonic materials."

Messiaen, who was born in France in 1908, died near Paris in 1992.

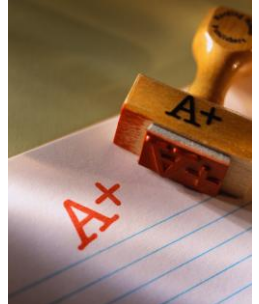

Emergency Phones Coming to Campus

As you are undoubtedly noticing throughout the HCC District, tall blue columns are sprouting up around the college's parking lots. These are emergency call stations, Hillsborough Community College's newest safety initiative. The installation of 81 emergency call stations has just been implemented.

These state-of-the-art emergency stations have been used with great success throughout the nation to provide emergency assistance through deterrence and quick response. HCC's call

stations will connect the user to the College's Department of Public Safety or Tampa Police (Ybor Parking Garage) in the event the user is in need of emergency services.

Each station has a light on top which is illuminated at all times. Once a station is activated through a call being placed, the blue light will strobe (flash), Public Safety Dispatch is immediately notified, and an officer will respond without delay. The stations are expected to be fully operational by no later than June.

Once all stations are installed, HCC will have the ability to add additional security features including

video surveillance and mass communication loud speakers. Surveillance will allow the Department of Public Safety to better monitor parking lots and low traffic areas, and mass communication loud speakers will allow them to alert all campuses or one parking lot of a potential safety concern or an actual emergency condition.

These stations are just one of several important new features that we are adding that complement the implementation of the new Hawk Card, increased patrols, and gate access for the Ybor City Garage and all other gated parking lots at the College, as well as the addition of multi-passenger golf carts at each campus to transport those who may need assistance on campus to and from their vehicles.

We will keep you fully informed as more of these exciting changes take place to ensure that we are providing the safest learning and work environment possible.
