Footnotes:

- 1) Enrollment is unduplicated; students with multiple programs are classified according to the highest level program found.
- 2) Adult General Education is the aggregation of Adult Basic Education, Adult English and GED Preparation.
- 3) Students enrolled in the Associate of Arts may have multiple program records. To unduplicate, students with an A.A. and an A.S. degree were counted only as an A.S. student under the heading Technical Programs and within the program subheading.
- 4) Developmental students are enrolled in at least one non-college level developmental course. Students are also coded in their intended program.
- 5) EAP students have been classified as prep or undergraduate based on course enrollment. Students are also coded in their intended program.
- 6) The workforce enrollment detail aggregates all credit enrollment related to the named associate degree, i.e. CC, ATD, ATC. Non-credit displays enrollment in PSAV certificates where such exist.
