The HCC Ybor School of Visual and Performing Arts Gallery is pleased to host an innovative collaboration between the Ybor Campus Art Department and Daytona State College's Southeast Center for Photographic Studies (SECPS). An **Opening Reception is planned for Thursday, September 9 from 7-9:00pm** in the Performing Arts Building, Palm Ave. and 15<sup>th</sup> Street.

SECPS faculty members exhibiting in the show include Dan Biferie, Gary Monroe, Eric Breitenbach, Bart Christner, Steven Benson, Laine Wyatt, Kevin Miller, Patrick Van Dusen and Steven Spencer. Each

photographer will present a series of recent work. Eric Breitenbach will present a series of photos from travels to “Exotic India;” Laine Wyatt's, “Interiors,” will navigate and explore interior public spaces; Gary Monroe will show a new series of work entitled “Registered Sex Offenders' Residences Within One Mile of an Arbitrary Address;” and Dan Biferie will show B&W prints from his recent project “Lake Woodruff National Wildlife Refuge” in Glenwood, Fl. Artists will be present at the opening reception to answer questions and discuss their photographs.

Author Ferdie Pacheco, the fabled Fight Doctor and one of Tampa's favorite sons, will be a featured guest at the 4<sup>th</sup> annual **Deep Carnivale: A Celebration of Words, September 10-12, 2010.**

On Saturday, September 11, at 10:00 AM at the Hillsborough Community College-Ybor Campus Performing Arts Building, Mr. Pacheco will discuss his life in Ybor City and give a reading from his latest book, ***Tales from the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Gym: Ali, the Dundees, and Miami's Golden Age of Boxing.*** There will be a coffee reception at 9:00 AM in the lobby of the HCC Performing Arts Building, 2112 North 15<sup>th</sup> Street, Ybor City, 33605. The event is free and open to the public.

Plenty of big-name boxers jab their way through these pages — Sugar Ray Leonard, Ezzard Charles and Jake LaMotta, to name a

few — but Muhammad Ali is the one to whom Pacheco (and the handful of co-authors he invited to join him in spinning yarns) returns again and again. The anecdotes, when strung together, paint a heartbreaking portrait...As with much of Florida's historical past, development plans KO'd the 5th Street Gym in 1993...but this richly illustrated book makes a more fitting memorial to its sweaty yet glorious past."

Deep Carnivale – A Celebration of Words is Tampa's premiere literature festival, brought to you by the Artists and Writers Group and Hillsborough Community College-Ybor City Campus. Each year, the festival brings together hundreds of arts enthusiasts of all ages, united around a common love of language and art. Programming at Deep Carnivale stretches from the playful to the avant garde, with activities for all ages, with a strong focus on literacy and the enjoyment of reading for our younger

guests.

The Ybor campus teaching lab school is a participant in the Florida State Food Program (FSFP). All licensed child care centers are required to provide nutritious meals. As a participant in the FSFP the Ybor CDC agrees to meet the USDA nutritional guidelines and complete detailed reporting to a local monitoring agency, Cornerstone Ministries. The state reimburses the center a percentage of the dollars spent on the nutritious foods according to the enrollment demographics.
