## Namingha's "Symbolism" Continues through Nov. 29

"Symbolism," a series of paintings by internationally-recognized artist **Dan Namingha** of Santa Fe, NM, will be at the HCC-Ybor Campus Art Gallery through Nov. 29, in celebration of Native American Heritage.

Namingha's images blend abstraction and reality and are bold and vivid. Namingha's paintings contain the emblems and symbols of Hopi ceremonies, to which he is strongly connected in both spirit and person.

"Dan Namingha may very well be the most gifted, original and important Native American painter currently at work...No doubt about it, Namingha is a major figure," states the San Francisco Chronicle.

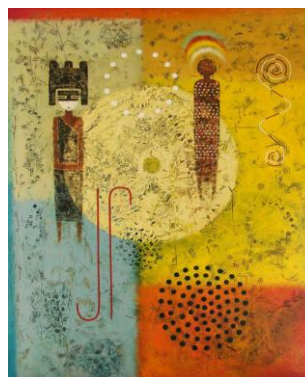
Raised in the combined tradition of two Pueblo peoples, the Hopi and Tewa, Namingha marries the colorful, geometric imagery of his indigenous roots with the tradition of twentieth-century abstract modernism. His artistic schooling includes formal

training at Santa Fe's Institute of American Indian Arts and studies at the University of Kansas and the American Academy of Art in Chicago.

Namingha has exhibited in galleries and museums on both coasts of the United States, including solo shows at the Fogg Art Museum at Harvard University, Carnegie Mellon University in Pennsylvania and the National Academy of Sciences in Washington, DC, as well as group exhibits in Texas, Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico and in Europe.

# HCC Donates Vital Firefighting Equipment to Barbados

The Caribbean American Chamber of Commerce, Tampa Bay, has implemented a number of programs to support initiatives organized by HCC's Center for International Education throughout Tampa Bay and the Caribbean region. The chamber recently facilitated a relationship with the Barbados Volunteer Fire Department and the local community colleges in Barbados.

Jack Evans, Dean of the Associate of Sciences program at HCC's Ybor City Campus, has visited Barbados frequently in recent years. Evans has been instrumental in developing a solid rapport with the Barbados Fire Department and local community colleges in Barbados, particularly through the implementation of training programs designed to address the needs of the local fire departments in Barbados.

Evans recently requested the support of CARIB Chamber and the Barbados

Association of Tampa Bay in arranging the immediate transfer of fire-fighting equipment donated by a Hillsborough Community College to Barbados fire departments who have an urgent need for these supplies. Catastrophes, such as the recent fire in Barbados which claimed the lives of six teenagers in Bridgetown, Barbados, will hopefully be mitigated through similar donations.

The supplies donated by HCC include Hazardous Material Training Suits, Wash Down Equipment and Self Contained Breathing Apparatus, which are necessities

in numerous volunteer fire departments in Barbados. Evans has expressed interest in working with the local Caribbean organizations in Tampa in order to assist HCC in transporting the pallets from Tampa to Barbados in the most efficient manner. The Barbados

Dr. Ken Atwater, the new HCC President, has stated that he has a significant interest in continuing to foster relations with local civic and business organizations in Tampa, and it is hoped that this cooperative ventures, and similar ones, will continue in the future.

### Thanksgiving Day Dessert Drawing Winner – Gina Yaquinto's "Pumpkin Trifle"

#### **Pumpkin Trifle**

- 1 Trifle Bowl
- 1 Spice Cake – made according to directions on box
- 1 – 16 oz can of pumpkin
- 1 t. Cinnamon    ¼ t. nutmeg    ¼ t. ginger    ¼ t. allspice
- 1 lg container cool whip
- 2-1/2 c. milk
- 4 pkgs instant butterscotch pudding
- 1 c. chopped pecans
- Make spice cake according to package and let cool.
- Mix pumpkin and spices with milk and pudding until smooth.
- Cut cake into small pieces.
- Layer, cake, pumpkin mixture and cool whip in a trifle bowl, continue in three layers. Top with remaining cool whip and chopped pecans around the edges.
