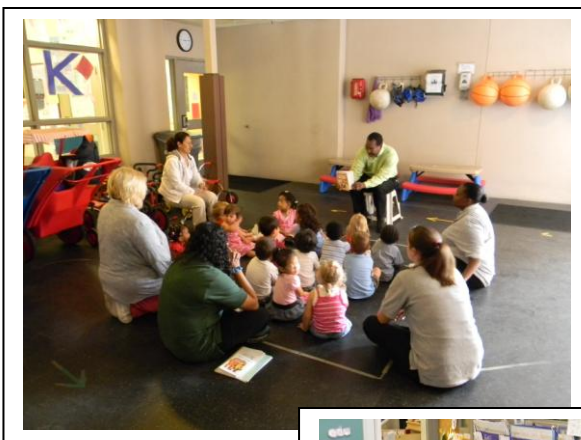

FWS Can Provide an Extra Set of Hands to Campus Departments



Would you like to have a student working in your department, but due to limited funds, do not have the budget to cover this expenditure? If yes, a Federal Work Study Student may be your solution!

The Federal Work Study (FWS) program offers excellent opportunities for students with financial need to gain meaningful work experience while earning money to help pay their educational expenses. The FWS award recipients are granted a designated amount of money, based upon their individual need and the availability of funds. It is from that allocation (which means that your department will not be responsible to provide the money to pay the student) that the student's wages (\$7.43 per hour) are paid bi-weekly at the minimum federal hourly rate of pay. Students usually work between 15-20 hours per week, around their class schedules, until they have earned the full amount of their FWS Grant awards.

If you are interested in having a Federal Work-Study student work in your department, please complete the attached form and return it to me ASAP. **Also, please keep in mind students who are eligible to work must provide you with the following documents before starting their assignment.**

- (1) A referral from Financial Aid and
- (2) A letter from the Career Resource Center Manager
