Ybor City Adjunct Professor Attending NEH workshop

Christopher Johnson, Adjunct Instructor in Humanities, will be attending a National Endowment for the Humanities workshop at Asheville, North Carolina, July 17-23. This workshop is

part of the NEH's "Landmarks of American History and Culture" series. The focus of the workshop will be on the legacy of Black Mountain College in Asheville. While in Asheville,

Mr. Johnson will be attending workshops and seminars organized by the Black Mountain College Museum and held at UNC-Asheville.

During its short existence (1933-1957), Black Mountain College was nationally recognized as a center in innovation in active, student-centered education. While at the conference, Mr. Johnson will be attending workshops centered on the extraordinary creative figures who taught at Black Mountain College, including Josef Albers (the German artist and teacher who was a leader of the Bauhaus school of the 1920s) and Buckminster Fuller (visionary futurist and inventor of the geodesic dome).

Essential to the curriculum of Black Mountain College was direct, hands-on experience with the arts-not with the aim of training professional artists, but with the aim of helping students learn through creative activity. One stated purpose of the workshop is to explore how the arts-centered and person-centered educational approach of Black Mountain College might be used in community college classrooms today, and Mr. Johnson hopes to return from the conference with new ideas about how to incorporate the art-related resources we have here at Ybor into his humanities courses.

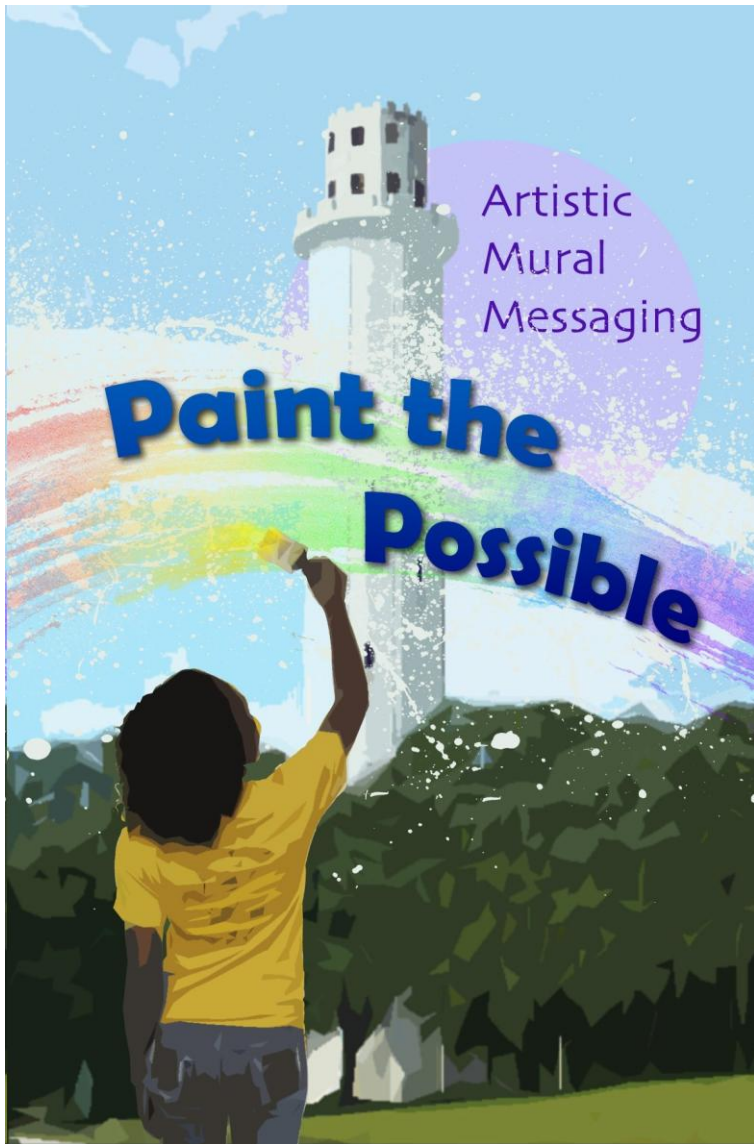
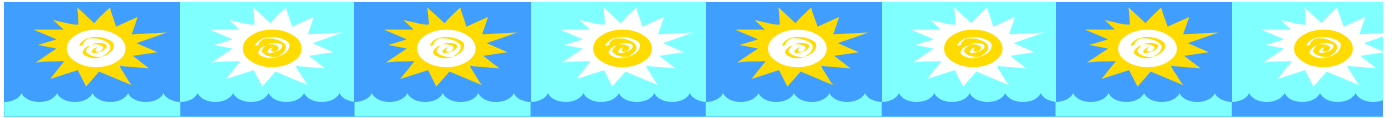
