Goal 1: Adequate Technology (Formerly Goal 5, combining 5 and 10)

Establish effective planning and financial allocation processes to ensure that the College has adequate and appropriate state-of-the-art technology for both academic and administrative purposes. Including classrooms and service areas for students. Each classroom should be made a "smart classroom" which would include computers, LCD projectors, DVD/CD/Video players, and speakers. This will permit faculty to utilize and integrate the software that comes with their texts into classroom lectures and activities.

At least one classroom in each campus building/location should provided computers at each student's desk. This would be in addition to the designated computer labs on each campus.

Goal 2: Student Learning and Success (Formerly Goal 1, combining 1 and 2)

Maintain appropriate and equitable access to the technology required to deliver effective learning opportunities and to provide high quality services to students both on and off-campus

Goal 3: Learning Resources

Provide technology-based learning resources that support and are aligned with academic and workforce development programs for both on and off-campus students

Goal 4: Distance Learning

Expand and support the use of information technology to provide effective distance learning programs and services to students. Technology help desk (24/7) available for Distance Learning students and faculty. Purchase and make available to faculty the synchronous software solutions which are presently available with streaming video and webcams.

Goal 5: Communication (Formerly Goal 7, combines 7 and 9)

Expand the use of information technology to enhance internal communication, user self-sufficiency, and productivity in the College's daily operations.

Electronic notification when a student has dropped a course.

Ability to submit email requests to duplicating for copying tests, etc online

Goal 6: Professional Development (Formerly Goal 8)

Provide and support ongoing faculty and staff development to increase awareness, knowledge and utilization of technology that enhances learning and productivity. This should be in collaboration with the efforts of IT 3 and other district sources of training. Faculty access and training in query reports that quickly

produce for a whole class the past student history in a particular discipline or for a particular course such as mathematics.

Goal 7: Technology Support (Formerly Goal 12)

Proactively assess current and emerging technical-support needs and provide appropriate and responsive support for all users. Create a Teaching Learning Technology Center which reviews/rates new technology on the market relevant to a discipline, trains the faculty in the use of the software/technology, and provides training to students.

Goal 8: Strategic Planning (Formerly Goal 11)

Continually track technology developments and institutional changes to identify new opportunities for improving teaching, learning, administration and services through technology
