

PURPOSE

The purpose of this administrative rule is to establish College policy regarding the financial aid programs at Hillsborough Community College.

RULE

The financial aid programs at Hillsborough Community College, which include scholarships, grants, loans and employment programs, are designed to provide financial assistance to students who would be unable to attend the College without such aid. Financial aid sources include federal, state and institutional funding sources which are administered by the Office of Financial Aid in accordance with the applicable federal and state laws, regulations and the College's administrative rules and procedures. The President will establish administrative procedures for the awarding, disbursement and accountability procedures required for federal, state and institutional financial aid sources. Eligibility criteria for federal and state financial aid programs are established by federal and state legislation. Eligibility criteria for college scholarship programs are established by the Board of Trustees.

The Office of Financial Aid will provide financial aid packages to students based on the requisite eligibility criteria and the availability of funds to best meet the financial aid needs of eligible recipients. The College participates in the following financial aid assistance programs authorized by Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965: Federal Pell Grant program, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant program, Federal Work-Study program, Federal Family Education Loan programs including subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford Loans, Federal Supplemental Loans for students and Federal Plus Loans, and the State Student Incentive Grant program. In addition, the College participates in the state financial aid programs under which the College is eligible. The College also has institutional scholarships established by the President and approved by the Board of Trustees which include but are not limited to the following scholarships: Art, Board of Trustees, Drama, Minority Incentive, Minority Need, Presidential, Athletic, HCC Need, Music, Publications, Student Support Services Need and Student Support Services Scholarships.
