With a more than 50-year history of educating the Tampa Bay region and impacting the local economy, HCC is poised to make an even greater difference in the

Founded in 1968 as part of the 28-member Florida College System, HCC is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. HCC includes five campuses, each with a unique identity reflective of the communities we serve, as well as three centers. We provide our students with engaging academic and campus life—including a wide array of support services, clubs, activities, service learning, and athletics programs—that fosters a well-rounded college experience.

HCC is the primary feeder for recent graduates of the School District of Hillsborough County, the eighth largest school district in the nation. We are the largest state college feeder to the University of South Florida. HCC also has a longstanding tradition of meeting workforce needs through our degree and certificate programs. Our Institute for Corporate and Continuing Education (ICCE) provides customized training for individuals and businesses.

Within the HCC footprint, the Brandon Campus fulfills a variety of educational needs for students of all ages. Its proximity to I-75 and the Selmon Expressway makes this campus highly accessible to surrounding areas. Campus leaders have forged meaningful partnerships with local business and industry, creating unique opportunities for students and faculty to collaborate.

FLORIDA ADVANCED TECHNOLOGICAL EDUCATION (FLATE) CENTER

HCC AT THE REGENT

This satellite location in nearby Riverview is part of the Brandon Campus. The Regent offers AA and AS degree transfer classes, continuing education, dual enrollment, a computer lab, and facilities rentals for the local community.

ROBOTICS PROGRAMS

The HCC Brandon Campus hosts robotics programs geared toward promoting STEM education among children and teens. From summer robotics camps to First LEGO League Robotics teams, students have an opportunity to learn valuable coding, problem solving and engineering skills on a college campus that gets them thinking about the future.


HCC Points of Pride SERVING OUR COMMUNITY FOR 50+ YEARS

For more than five decades HCC has served the residents of Tampa Bay through our educational programs and services. Under the leadership of our President Dr. Ken Atwater, HCC continues to grow and thrive in one of the largest counties in Florida. Here are some highlights. As we begin our sixth decade of life-changing work, HCC proudly fosters academic excellence, inclusivity and opportunity, innovation and creativity, and the exploration of new ideas, while placing great value on each student's unique learning experience.

- Each year more than 47,000 students pursue their educational goals at HCC.
- Small class sizes, affordable tuition and guaranteed transferability to other state colleges and universities make HCC an ideal choice for students.
- Our five distinct campuses and three centers create a vibrant, diverse college experience.
- Campus life includes more than 80 clubs, organizations and groups.
- Our competitive and nationally recognized athletic teams include men's and women's basketball, men's baseball, and women's volleyball, softball and tennis.
- HCC offers flexible course options, from online and hybrid learning to traditional classrooms and hands-on experience.
- HCC students to complete apprenticeship programs have a 100% placement rate.
- Approximately 94% of HCC full-time faculty hold advanced degrees.

- Thousands of HCC students volunteer their time and talents outside the classroom to serve the community. Their volunteer hours have an estimated value of \$24.69/hour.

INVESTING & GROWING

- As our region's leader in training a skilled workforce, HCC fuels the economic and social viability of our community by generating a \$1.3 billion annual economic impact.
- HCC represents a 17.9% return on investment to taxpayers.
- The present value of higher earnings and social savings in Florida by HCC students is \$112.5 million.
- HCC advisory boards, comprised of local employers, partner with us to develop programs that meet labor market needs empowering our students with marketable skills and direct avenues to job placement.
- For every \$1.00 students invest in HCC, they receive \$4.80 in higher future earnings over the course of their careers.
- Our current students will receive a present value of \$1.2 billion in increased earnings over their careers, representing an annual rate of return of 18.7 percent.
- As one of the top 20 employers in Hillsborough County, HCC includes more than 3,200 full-time and part-time faculty and staff members with a payroll of \$75.2 million.

SOUTHSHORE is positioned in the southern part of the county, where Tampa Bay meets the Gulf of Mexico. The HCC SouthShore Campus helps fulfill this growing area's higher education needs.

PLANT CITY – at the easternmost part of the county – is the Winter Strawberry Capital of the World and hosts an annual Strawberry Festival. Its slower paced, small town flavor offers a relaxed, historic charm.

The northern part of the county offers a variety of neighborhoods that attract families NEW TAMPA, TEMPLE TERRACE, WESTCHASE and LUTZ. North of downtown is also home to popular attractions such as Busch Gardens, Adventure Island, and Lowry Park Zoo.

Application Process

With an **application deadline of March 6**, Dr. Atwater expects to hire a new HCC Brandon Campus president by July 1, 2020.

Applicants must attach a copy of their transcripts at the time of application showing at least the minimum qualifications. In addition, application materials must include: (1) letter of interest addressing how the candidate meets the qualifications outlined above, (2) a current résumé, and (3) contact information for at least five professional references. If the transcript has not been updated to show the awarding of the required degree, applicants must bring written documentation from the educational institution showing when the degree was awarded.
