At Hillsborough Community College (HCC), we pride ourselves on creating an exciting and inclusive environment for all of our students. HCC students with disabilities have every opportunity to make the most of their college experience through academic adjustments within our programs, organizations, services and activities. Our faculty and staff are dedicated to the overall success of our diverse student population.



How do I apply for academic adjustments?

Current and prospective students must self-identify and provide appropriate documentation of a disability to the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities (OSSD). All documentation provided to the OSSD must be on letterhead and signed by the professional completing the paperwork.

Academic adjustments must be requested prior to the start of registration for each semester that you plan to attend. Your requests can take up to five business days to be processed. Lastminute requests for academic adjustments are not guaranteed.

Am I eligible to receive academic adjustments?

You may be eligible for disability-related services if you have a documented disability as defined by the ADA Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA). Eligible disabilities include, but are not limited to, the following:

ADD/ADHD

AIDS

Alcohol/Drug Abuse

Autism Spectrum

Hearing Impairment

Physical Impairment

Psychiatric Disability

Specific Learning Disability

Speech/Language Impairment

Visual Impairment

The existence of a disability does not necessitate the provision of academic adjustments.

Eligibility is determined on an individual basis. The OSSD will determine appropriate academic adjustments through an interactive process with the student.

The ADAAA defines a person with a disability as any person who has a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more of the person's major life activities; has a record of such impairment; or is regarded as having such impairment.

What academic adjustments are available to me?

Depending upon documentation provided, available academic adjustments and auxiliary aids include, but are not limited to, the following:



Academic advising



Scribes and readers



Alternative testing arrangements



Sign language interpreters




Books in alternative format



Visual magnifiers



Notetakers



How do I request my academic adjustment memos?

The OSSD uses an automated digital system called Accommodate to notify faculty, staff and students of approved academic adjustment requests. You will receive your academic adjustment memo via HawkMail.

Students are required to request an academic adjustment memo at the start of each semester.




What are my responsibilities?

Students registered with and receiving services from the OSSD have the following responsibilities:

- Notify the OSSD at least five business days in advance if you require testing adjustments such as a separate room or extra time. If you qualify for testing adjustments, make arrangements with your instructor prior to each exam. In addition, make an appointment at your campus test center at least 24 hours in advance.
- Request your <u>academic adjustment memo</u> prior to or at the beginning of each semester and provide a copy to each of your instructors.
- Notify the OSSD as soon as possible if you require a <u>notetaker</u>. Remember, your notetaker does not take your place in class. Repeated absences without 24-hour notice may result in temporary suspension of services.
- Notify the OSSD as soon as possible if you require an interpreter.
- Make arrangements with the OSSD at least a week prior to each exam for a reader and/or a scribe during testing.
- Equipment and supplies may be borrowed from the OSSD. These items must be returned at the end of each semester. Keep in mind you're financially responsible for what you borrow.



HCC facilities, as a whole, are accessible to persons with physical disabilities via ramps, automatic entrances and elevators. Accessible restrooms, parking and water fountains are also available. All HCC campuses provide parking spaces for vehicles with state approved disabled parking decals or license plates.
