

Articulation Agreement

FOR A TRANSFER PROGRAM BETWEEN

Hospitality & Tourism Management and Hillsborough Community College

School of Hospitality Management Florida International University

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The purpose of this agreement is to enhance the process of transfer of the graduates of the Associate in Science (AS) in Hospitality & Tourism Program from Hillsborough Community College (HCC) to the Bachelor of Science in Hospitality Management at Florida International University (FIU). This agreement shall establish the conditions under which students from HCC shall progress to a junior year status as a Hospitality Management major in the School of Hospitality Management at FIU. In addition, the agreement shall include the formation of mechanisms for the ongoing monitoring and review of articulation progress and adherence to the conditions.

1. Program of Study

- 1.1 Participating students shall complete at HCC
 - An AS degree in Hospitality Management or Culinary Management
 - All the specified courses listed in the Appendix
- 1.2 All the courses specified in the Appendix are transferable to FIU. Therefore, participating students will be able to complete at FIU a program of study in a time, which equals approximately the number of hours required in the junior and senior years of the degree program being sought.

2. Admissions and Readmission

- 2.1 HCC is an open-admissions institution that assesses the holders of a high school diploma (or equivalent) wishing to enter this program and places them into courses on the basis of their academic background and/or demonstrated experience in specific courses. Applicants may be required to participate in the HCC assessment program.
- 2.2 A student completing the program of study in 1.1 will be guaranteed admission with junior standing to the Hospitality Management Program at FIU.

3. Conditions of Admission

3.1 In order to assure the admission and academic success of participating students, HCC and FIU agree to continuously develop, maintain, and improve a program management and reporting system.

3.2 Each institution will:

- appoint a program coordinator to coordinate activities, monitor student program, and evaluate and improve the program.
- exchange regularly updated copies of their general catalogs and any publications, which may be helpful in advising students.
- provide timely information about significant changes in the program of study that relate to the preparation of participating students, and
- share any other information that HCC and FIU believe helpful to monitor and assure the academic success of participating students.
- 3.3 The program coordinators from each institution will annually assess the program in collaboration with participating faculty, advisors, and students in order to continuously improve the program. A report of the assessment and recommendations for improvement will be provided to the program coordinator at HCC and the Associate Dean for Academics of the School of Hospitality Management at FIU.

3.3 Conditions of admission: AS students:

- are strongly encouraged to satisfy the math and English section of the CLAST prior to transfer.
- will meet the 2.0 admissions GPA as all other Hospitality majors.
- must earn a "C" or higher in all prerequisite course work.

4. Termination/Modification

- 4.1 This Articulation Agreement is subject to change or modification by mutual written consent between the parties hereto.
- 4.2 This Articulation Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party given at least one year in advance of such termination date. However, it is understood and agreed that any student participating in the AS in Hospitality or Culinary Management Program at HCC who has specifically been tracked for admission to FIU, or who has already been admitted to FIU by this agreement, will be permitted to complete the program notwithstanding the termination provisions above, so long as the student remains in good academic standing and is making measured progress towards completion of a degree program.
