

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF HILLSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
FLORIDA AGRICULTURAL AND MECHANICAL UNIVERSITY
FOR
ASSOCIATE IN ARTS (AA) DEGREE OR ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE (AS) DEGREE EARLY CHILDHOOD MANAGEMENT
AND
BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN PREK/ELEMENTARY EDUCATION WITH CONCENTRATIONS IN PREK/PRIMARY
EDUCATION OR ELEMENTARY EDUCATION**

THIS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is hereby made and entered into on this 1st day of January 2018, between the District Board of Trustees of Hillsborough Community College ("HCC") and the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University ("FAMU").

WITNESSETH

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement is to facilitate the transfer of the Associate in Arts from HCC or the Associate in Science in Early Childhood Management from HCC to FAMU, in the Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with either a concentration in PreK/Primary or Elementary Education, for students who complete specified courses in each respective discipline. Students who complete other courses within the Associate in Arts degree are eligible to transfer to FAMU, but may be required to complete additional courses in order to meet the prerequisites of the Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with either a concentration in PreK/Primary or Elementary Education.

I. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- A. Students must pass the General Knowledge (GK) exam before applying to FAMU.
- B. Students must submit an application and official transcripts to the Admissions Office at FAMU prior to the admissions deadline for each term.
- C. Students must complete at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the total credits required for their Bachelor's Degree in residence at FAMU.
- D. Associate in Arts Option:
 - a. Students must complete an Associate in Arts at HCC with prerequisite coursework delineated in Exhibit A: Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with a concentration in PreK/Primary Education or
 - b. Students must complete an Associate in Arts at HCC with prerequisite coursework delineated in Exhibit B: Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with a concentration in Elementary Education.
- E. Associate in Science Option:
 - a. Students must complete an Associate in Science in Early Childhood Management at HCC with prerequisite coursework delineated in Exhibit C: Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with a concentration in PreK/Primary Education or,
 - b. Students must complete an Associate in Science in Early Childhood Management at HCC with prerequisite coursework delineated in Exhibit D: Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with a concentration in Elementary Education.

II. CREDIT TRANSFERABILITY

- A. All credits from the Associate in Arts or Associate in Science in Early Childhood Management Degrees completed will be accepted by FAMU, with the exception of courses in which students earned a grade of "D" or "F."
- B. FAMU will accept no fewer than 60 credits from the Associate in Arts or Associate in Science in Early Childhood Management Degrees and no more than 90 credits from an HCC degree program to be

used towards the in the Bachelor of Science in Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with either a concentration in PreK/Primary or Elementary Education. Students must maintain a minimum overall GPA requirement of 3.0, including grade forgiveness.

- C. FAMU will accept CLEP, AP, IB, AICES, DANTES, dual enrollment, and other standardized credits. FAMU will conduct its own evaluation on any other articulated or transferred credits taken at an institution other than HCC.

III. COORDINATION

- A. HCC will allow FAMU representatives to conduct on-campus visits in accordance with HCC policy to provide information about their programs to students and staff.
- B. FAMU will provide HCC with relevant transfer information and requested current catalogs and brochures.
- C. FAMU will refrain from encouraging HCC students to enroll at FAMU, until they complete their program of study at HCC.
- D. FAMU and HCC agree to allow students to reciprocally complete Field Practicum hours as agreed upon by college and university faculty and staff.
- E. Both institutions will provide information about the Agreement and make access to the Agreement available to students, alumni, faculty, and staff.
- F. In any joint promotions, HCC will be identified as the provider of the first two years of the college degree, and FAMU will be identified as the provider of the junior and senior level courses.
- G. Both institutions will notify each other with any planned curricular changes affecting the future of this Agreement and will exchange any other information each believe may be helpful to assure the academic success of participating students.

IV. TERM AND TERMINATION

This Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2018, and will automatically renew annually for five (5) consecutive years, unless the Agreement is terminated by either party. Termination by either party requires ninety (90) days prior written notice of the date of termination. Termination of this Agreement will not affect students who have been accepted into FAMU Bachelor of Science in Bachelor of Science in Pre-Kindergarten/Elementary Education with either a concentration in PreK/Primary or Elementary Education. This Agreement is subject to change or modification by mutual written consent between the parties.


