Articulated Programs Agreement

Between

The Hillsborough Community College

and

Eckerd College

This Agreement is entered into this <u>17th</u> day of <u>August</u>, 2004, by and between the District Board of Trustees of Hillsborough Community College and the Board of Trustees of Eckerd College.

WHEREAS, HCC and Eckerd College's Program for Experienced Learners (PEL) desire to coordinate curricula so students may move easily from the last HCC course in a sequence to the next course in a program at Eckerd College.,

WHEREAS, HCC and the Program for Experienced Learners at Eckerd College desire the effective use of their resources to provide those seeking higher education with a wider range of options in achieving their educational goals.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree to cooperate in articulating programs so students may take full advantage of educational opportunities best suited to their individual needs.

I. Programs & Courses Articulated:

II. For HCC graduates with an Associate in Arts Degree or Associate in Science in the specified programs (Business Administration and International Business) with a GPA of 2.0 better or during the period of this agreement, Eckerd College will agree to the following:

- A. HCC students who have earned an Associate in Arts Degree are eligible for a direct transfer to Eckerd College and enter with junior standing. HCC students who have earned an Associate in Science in the specified programs (Business Administration and International Business) are eligible for direct transfer in accordance with the courses articulated between both institutions, given that they earned a grade of C in each course. HCC students seeking admission to Eckerd College without an AA degree or from other AS programs will be treated in accordance with regular Eckerd College policy for transfer students. The granting of transfer credit will be determined by an evaluation of each course.
- B. Transferring HCC students will follow the Eckerd College catalog for enrollment procedures, residency, and graduation purposes.
- C. HCC students may transfer up to 63 semester hours to Eckerd College. It is understood that students must fulfill the Eckerd College prerequisites for junior and senior level courses.
- E. Eckerd College expects that students will have completed courses in four (4) academic areas of general education. These areas include, Social Science, Humanities, Art, and Natural Science.
- F. Only courses taken at Eckerd College will be used in compiling the Eckerd College cumulative grade point average. To graduate from Eckerd College, a student must have earned a 2.0 cumulative grade point average on work attempted at Eckerd College, including authorized repeated courses.
- G. To provide a smooth transition in the transfer process, Eckerd College will send recruiters/articulation advisors to HCC and provide students with assistance on the enrollment and transfer process.
- III. HCC, during the period of this Agreement with Eckerd College, agrees to the following:
 - A. The Articulation Agreement between HCC and Eckerd College's Program for Experienced Learners will be publicized among the faculty, students and in the HCC college catalog.
 - B. The recommended general education requirements of Eckerd College and the course equivalents list will be made available to faculty members, counselors, and students at HCC.
 - C. HCC will cooperate with Program for Experienced Learners' admissions personnel to have conferences with students who are interested in transferring to Eckerd College.
 - D. HCC will allow the Program for Experienced Learners to offer classes not available on the HCC campus as needed to accommodate student desires. HCC will provide classroom space and instructional equipment. Eckerd will provide the instructors.

THIS AGREEMENT shall be continuous from the date first shown on page one of this Agreement. Both parties shall meet for a review of this Agreement as necessary after its inception. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party, provided the termination shall not become effective until after the current term has been completed.
